Great result from SASS Day

SWAN parishioners came to the party last Sunday bringing cans, packaged food and notes to the value of almost \$1400 to help support those in need this winter.

It was SASS Day (formerly Good Neighbour Sunday), which had the aim of restocking the Swan Anglican Support Services' food reserves.

SASS co-ordinator Janet Hewett described the donations as "heart-warming". "This (the donations) gives us a kick start for the year and, with continued donations, we will be able to give a generous food hamper to people in need," she said.

"The \$25 gift vouchers give the final touch by providing a means for our clients to obtain urgent items they would other-

wise not be able to have." Cash donations at All Saints totalled \$455 and at St Mary's \$470, while donations of tins and packaged food were valued at \$250 at All Saints and \$200 at St Mary's.

The day also had a fun element, with worshippers dressed in casual

warm clothing with beanies the headwear of choice.

There was also a change to the usual morning fayre, with a breakfast of BBQ bacon and eggs at All Saints and croissants with various fillings at St Mary's.

ANNUAL MEETING TODAY

THIS Sunday, there will be only one service in the Swan parish, a combined service in St Mary's, starting at 9am.

In a joint statement afterwards, church wardens Gaye Moses and Sharon Zuiddam said discussion centred around planning to guide the parish into the future and described the meeting as "very fruitful".

As some new members will be elected to the parish council at the annual meeting today, it was decided to postpone the whole-of-parish meeting until late August or September.

Mr Tranter, who will lead the engagement meeting, will provide his time and expertise pro bono.
