Rob gets extension to Jan 31

THE Rev'd Rob Healy will be with us as locum priest of the Swan Parish for the next six months at least.

This was confirmed by Bishop Jeremy James on July 8.

Rob's tenure has been extended until January 31, 2023, which means he will be with us for Christmas celebrations.

It also means Rob (pictured) will be in the parish at least a year, as he took up his locum ministry on February 6, 2022.

The extension of his tenure gives the parish some permanency, in the short term at least, and Rob some peace of mind on his immediate future.

"Kaye and I were encouraged by the reaction of folk at both All Saints and St Mary's," he said. The applause was a lift for our spirits, but is also humbling.

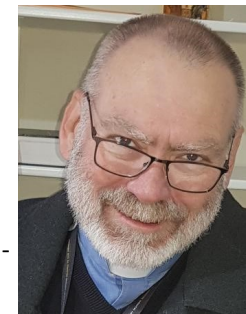
"We seek to serve the Lord and to

Craft group desperate for new members

ONE of the oldest Swan parish groups still active is desperately looking for more members.

The Parish Craft Group, started in 2002, is now down to just four members after reaching a peak of 25 several years ago.

Member Elaine Kerr said the group started with just a few members meeting on Tuesday afternoons in the Minchin centre, with the aim of encouraging parishioners to work on all things “crafty”.

Many concentrated on quilting and patchwork with joint projects being organised for the church fete craft stall.

“As a group we made the quilt depicting the Cross, which now hangs in St Mary’s Church, and a smaller piece which hangs from the lectern in All Saints Church,” she said.

“Our group provided a great opportunity for Nancy (former rector Nancy Scott) and her carer to join us fortnightly

until covid. We were also privileged to have Stella Ryan join us, knitting beanies, scarfs and blanket squares.

“We celebrated Stella’s 90th birthday eight years ago at a local café and presented her with a special quilt made by the group, but she sadly left us recently at the age of 98 and is much missed.”

Elaine said the group periodically attended friendship days held by other craft groups, enabling members to meet people with similar interests and share ideas.

“But due to the present size of our group, we are unable to reciprocate with our own friendship day,” she said. “But we still meet socially to celebrate birthdays, Christmas or just for fun.”

Following covid, the group meets fortnightly in the homes of members, as well as occasionally in the Minchin Centre.

Parish candles now available to all

The Swan Parish candle production line is back in action following the return from Germany of Helga Aldinger.

As we reported in the June 5 PnP, Helga and husband Carl found candle remnants during a parish clean-up and looked into ways of recycling them.

A friend subsequently donated candle-making equipment worth about \$200 and also conducted a “workshop”, during which Helga and Carl made an initial batch of candles.



Then Helga flew off to Germany and production ceased.

Or so we thought. But husband Karl decided to go it alone, unsupervised (!), and by the time Helga returned recently, there were boxes of candles ready for despatch.

That means we now have candles for St Mary’s worshippers, who missed out on the first batch. They come in two “flavours”, English rose and lemon lavender.

The candles are priced at \$12, with all money raised going to the parish.
