Thankyou and I hope it will be repeated next year, definitely with a cost applied.

**Shirley Reynolds:** I would like to see next vear's service start with the washing of feet (perhaps just two people) and then go to the Passover meal.

**Edith Mpikamezo:** We could include washing of As Grains of Wheat the feet by either the priest or the deacon (select At The Name of Jesus few to have their feet washed). Also, someone could present as Jesus, dressed in a robe, sitting with the disciples, blessing the bread and wine, before sharing. We could shorten the service to accommodate all activities.

**<u>Ianet Hewett</u>**: The Passover Supper was well prepared with wine goblets and a meal of sliced lamb, bread and olives, which gave an authentic feel for a Passover meal. A suggestion of foot washing to be included before the meal may help us reflect on humility and service.

Helen Wakefield: A dinner with our Lord not to be missed, humble and intimate. Ideas for next year: Somehow incorporate the service into the Passover meal. Also have a chair of honour for our Lord (maybe the Bishop's chair), placed at the table. A huge thank-you to Les and Tom for making Maundy Thursday such a memorable evening.

Sharon started her formation programme on Palm Sunday after receiving the blessing of Perth Archbishop Kay Goldsworthy.

Sharon has been a member of the Swan parish for over 21 years, during which she has been a church warden, LPM, worship team leader, synod rep. and a children's ministry leader.

Members of her family have also been heavily involved in church activities.

She is now studying for her Master of Divinity degree at Wollaston Theological College.

"This is a journey to get closer to God," Sharon said on Sunday.

ALL Saints church was filled to overflowing on April 4 for the funeral of former parishioner Walter Ruzvidzo, who

died suddenly in Port Hedland on March 3, aged 52.

He is mourned by his wife Catherine, Grace work (12), Gabriel years (11), Malachi work

(5) and Miriam (3 later this month). Catherine is also pregnant with their fifth child.

The funeral service was conducted by former Swan parish priest Rev. Stuart Fenner.

The Ruzvidzo family worshipped in the parish for over 12 years, three years of which they lived in the Mitchell Cottage at All Saints.

Catherine and the children are now staying with her mother, Swan parishioner Judith Cooper in Beechboro.

The family has since flown to Port Hedland (where Walter worked as a tradesman for Westrack) to retrieve his furniture and belongings.
