THE dozen or so members of the Swan Anglican Support Service team are doing an excellent job in helping local people in their time of need.

And the good news is the team is receiving more support from parishioners.

SASS co-ordinator Janet Hewett said each visitor to the food distribution point in the Minchin Centre on a Saturday afternoon receives two food packages containing tinned and packaged food to the value of about \$60 plus a \$25 Woolworths gift voucher.

And the project is set to get a further boost next Sunday at our annual Good Neighbour Day at both churches, with parishioners urged to bring along either tinned or packaged food with a bank note wrapped around the donated item(s)!

Cashing in on bottles and cans

THE bottle and can recycling project devised by treasurer Greg Fawell is continuing to provide a steady stream of income into the parish coffers.

Cans are collected each week and taken to a recycling station, where a special code allows the money earned to be paid straight into the parish bank account.

Greg said while “earnings” to date had not been earth-shattering, the initiative had yielded \$275.70 since April.

The cans and bottles are collected at All Saints by Mike Salmon and St Mary’s by Marlene Perriman.

Greg said the project was well-supported with bags of cans and bottles turning up each week .

“Marlene seems to have a regular deposit at the Malaga facility and both she and Mike are doing an amazing job,” he said.

“We encourage placing a bank note around the food as we only received a \$250 grant this year, although last year we had \$1000,” Janet said. “We estimate \$1200 is needed to be able to fulfil the needs for our clients.”

Janet said items particularly needed at the moment are milk, cereal, chunky meals in a tin, soup, tinned vegetables, tinned fruit, baked beans, spaghetti, pasta, pasta sauce, tinned tomatoes, tuna/salmon, tinned chicken, spam and corned beef.

The donated items are stored in the Minchin Centre and made up into standard packages by SASS members, who are drawn from both churches.

Parishioners are encouraged to donate food items each Sunday, placing them in the baskets provided at the entrance to both churches

NEXT Sunday is SASS Day, when we actively think about the well-being of people less fortunate than ourselves and the elderly during the cold winter months.

It’s a fun day on which we dress up in casual warm clothing not usually associated with church services.

The day has undergone a name change this year. Previously known as Good Neighbour Sunday and, before that, Cuddle-up Sunday, the latest name reflects and supports the Swan Anglican Support Service (SASS) initiative of providing canned and packaged food to the needy.

Parish warden Sharon Zuiddam said

the day started in 2012, as Cuddle-up Sunday. “We decided to hold it in the winter, when many underprivileged are suffering from the cold,” she said.. “The idea was to get donations of food, blankets and money for those less fortunate. “

Next Sunday at St Mary’s, there will be a warming fire and a mug of hot chocolate to welcome church-goers, with hot croissants and various fillings for morning tea, while at All Saints, there will be bacon and egg breakfast sandwiches.

And please don’t forget to bring some canned and packaged food (see story pages 1 and 2 for required items).
