The donated food items will be distributed by SASS in the form of food hampers on Saturday afternoons in the Minchin Centre.

SASS member Marlene Perriman said the parish was in particular need of canned fruit, spaghetti, baked beans and complete meals.

## THE DAY OF PENTECOST

NEXT Sunday we celebrate another significant day in the Christian church, the Day of Pentecost, marking the descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' disciples after His Ascension.

Pentecost literally means "50", as the festival falls 50 days after Jesus' Crucifixion, the seventh Sunday after Easter (Acts 2, v1-31).

The festival of Pentecost is important to Christians because it represents the beginning of the Christian Church. It reminds us how Jesus' promise that God would send the Holy Spirit was fulfilled.

Red is used at Pentecost, recalling the fiery tongues that descended upon the Apostles when they received the Holy Spirit, and also at feasts of the Holy Cross, Apostles and martyrs, as symbol of their bloody passions (sufferings and deaths).

There is also the Pentecostal Church a form of Christianity that emphasises the work of the Holy Spirit and the direct experience of the presence of God by the believer.

Our "Day of Pentecost" services next Sunday will be held at the usual times, 7.30am at All Saints and 10am at St Mary's.
